Investment Objective and Strategy

The fundamental investment objective of **First Trust AlphaDEX™ U.S. Consumer Staples Sector Index ETF** (the "First Trust ETF") is to replicate, to the extent possible, the performance of the StrataQuant® Consumer Staples Index ("Index"), net of expenses.

The investment strategy of the First Trust ETF is to invest in and hold the constituent securities of the Index in the same proportion as they are reflected in the Index or securities intended to replicate the performance of such Index. The Index results from applying the AlphaDEX[™] methodology to the Russell 1000® Index, a market index representing the large and mid-capitalization segment of the U.S. equity universe, and then selecting the constituent securities for the Index from those qualifying stocks included in the Consumer Staples Sector.

The Manager may use a sampling methodology in selecting investments for the First Trust ETF. As an alternative or in conjunction with investing in and holding constituent securities, the First Trust ETF may also invest in other securities to obtain exposure to the constituent securities of the applicable Index in a manner that is consistent with the investment objective and investment strategy of the First Trust ETF.

In this case, the First Trust ETF may also obtain exposure to the applicable Index by holding securities of a US-listed index ETF, First Trust Consumer Staples AlphaDEX® Fund (NYSE Arca ticker: FXG), of an affiliate of the Manager, which replicates or substantially replicates the applicable Index.

Risk

Given that the underlying index that the First Trust ETF seeks to replicate has not changed, the risks associated with an investment in the First Trust ETF remain as discussed in the First Trust ETF's most recent prospectus. The First Trust ETF provides exposure to the consumer staples sector of the U.S. equity market in either a non-U.S. currency hedged and U.S. currency hedged manner.

Results of Operations

General

The First Trust ETF's total net asset value as of June 30, 2019 was \$5,838,921 or \$23.71 per Unit ("FHC") and \$18.61 per Hedged Unit ("FHC.F"). The First Trust ETF's total net asset value as of December 31, 2018 was \$6,607,395 or \$22.80 per FHC and \$17.31 per FHC.F.

For the six-month period ended June 30, 2019, the First Trust ETF paid total cash distributions per unit of \$0.2745 for FHC and \$0.0996 for FHC.F. In addition, the First Trust ETF declared cash distributions per unit of \$0.07 for FHC and \$0.0525 for FHC.F for record date of June 28, 2019 with payment date of July 8, 2019.

Investment Performance

For the six-month period ended June 30, 2019, FHC returned 4.56% compared to Russell 1000[®] Consumer Staples Index (CAD) (the "benchmark") total return of 7.19% while FHC.F returned 8.04% compared to Russell 1000[®] Consumer Staples Index (USD) (the "hedged benchmark") total return of 12.03%. Unlike the benchmark and the hedged benchmark, the First Trust ETF's returns are net of fees and expenses.

As of June 30, 2019, the consumer staples sector accounted for 5.89% of the weight of the Russell 1000® Index. The benchmark underperformed the Russell 1000® Index (CAD) which returned 13.70%. The hedged benchmark underperformed the Russell 1000® Index (USD) which returned 18.84%.

The portfolio held 34 equity securities as of June 30, 2019. The top ten equity holdings accounted for 47.74% of the portfolio. The AlphaDEX[™] stock selection process is a rules-based process and can result in industry weightings that differ from that of the benchmark and the hedged benchmark.

The First Trust ETF underperformed during the period due to stock selection, mostly within the Personal Care, Drug & Grocery Stores industry. Poor stock selection within the Food, Beverage, & Tobacco industry also contributed to the

underperformance. Specifically, within the Personal Care sub-industry, a significant underweight position in Procter & Gamble Company contributed to the underperformance as this stock performed well during the period. Strong industry allocation mitigated the underperformance, mostly due to an overweight position in the Foods sub-industry.

FHC suffered from its exposure to the U.S. dollar during the period as the U.S. dollar depreciated 4.0% against the Canadian dollar from December 31, 2018, to June 30, 2019. The depreciation of the U.S dollar relative to the Canadian dollar contributed positively to the performance of FHC.F during the period because it is not exposed to movements in the U.S. dollar.

The top five stocks by contribution to return were Tyson Foods, Inc. Class A, Pilgrim's Pride Corporation, Conagra Brands, Inc., J.M. Smucker Company, and Post Holdings, Inc. The bottom five stocks by contribution to return were Kraft Heinz Company, Kroger Co., Herbalife Nutrition Ltd., Walgreens Boots Alliance Inc, and Sprouts Farmers Markets, Inc.

Recent Developments

During the first half of 2019, the Russell 1000® Index rebounded from steep losses in the fourth quarter of 2018 to post a 17.68% price return. The U.S dollar depreciated relative to the Canadian dollar during the period, meaning the index gained 13.09% over the same period measured in Canadian dollars. U.S. government bonds rallied during the period, with the yield on the benchmark U.S. 10-year Treasury note falling from 2.68% at the end of 2018 to 2.01% on June 28, 2019. Yields fell on fears of an economic slowdown and subsequent indications from the Federal Reserve, the central bank of the United States, that it would cut interest rates if necessary to sustain the economic expansion. The Federal Reserve cited trade developments and slowing global growth as reasons for more accommodative monetary policy. The expectation of a rate cut in July helped fuel the rally in U.S. equity markets during the first half of the year. Real GDP grew at a robust 3.1% annual rate in the first quarter of 2019 and the U.S. economy continued its streak of job creation, extending it to 105 months during the first half of the year. Earnings growth slowed in the first half of the year, but earnings growth was robust in 2018 following the passage of the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act in 2017. Following the market gain in the first half of the year, the Russell 1000® Index finished June trading at a P/E multiple of 20.0 with a dividend yield of 1.93%.

FT Portfolios Canada Co. is the Manager of the First Trust ETF and is a Canadian affiliate of First Trust Advisors L.P., the investment advisor (the "Advisor") of the First Trust ETF.

Pursuant to terms of the declaration of trust of the First Trust ETF, the Manager provides or arranges for all management, administrative and other services required by the First Trust ETF. The Manager receives a management fee from the First Trust ETF. For further details, please see "Management Fees".

The Manager has retained the Advisor to provide certain services to the First Trust ETF pursuant to an investment advisory agreement. The Advisor receives advisory fees from the Manager out of the management fee.

(1) Management expense ratio is based on total expenses (excluding commissions and other portfolio transaction costs) for the stated period/year and is expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net asset value during the period/year.

(2) The trading expense ratio represents total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net asset value during the period/year.

(3) The First Trust ETF's portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively the First Trust ETF's portfolio advisor manages its portfolio investments. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the First Trust ETF buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the period/year. The higher a First Trust ETF's portfolio turnover rate in a period/year, the greater the trading cost payable by the First Trust ETF in the period/year, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the period/year. There is not necessarily a relationship between high turnover rate and the performance of a First Trust ETF.

Management Fees

The First Trust ETF will pay the Manager a management fee of 0.70% based on the average daily NAV of the First Trust ETF. The management fee, plus applicable taxes including HST, will be accrued daily and paid monthly in arrears. The Manager may, from time to time in its discretion, waive all or a portion of the management fee charged at any given time.


Past Performance

General
