

Investment Objective and Strategy

The fundamental investment objective of **First Trust AlphaDEX™ U.S. Consumer Staples Sector Index ETF** (the "First Trust ETF") is to replicate, to the extent possible, the performance of the StrataQuant® Consumer Staples Index ("Index"), net of expenses.

The investment strategy of the First Trust ETF is to invest in and hold the constituent securities of the Index in the same proportion as they are reflected in the Index or securities intended to replicate the performance of such Index. The Index results from applying the AlphaDEX™ methodology to the Russell 1000® Index, a market index representing the large and mid-capitalization segment of the U.S. equity universe, and then selecting the constituent securities for the Index from those qualifying stocks included in the Consumer Staples Sector.

The Manager may use a sampling methodology in selecting investments for the First Trust ETF. As an alternative or in conjunction with investing in and holding constituent securities, the First Trust ETF may also invest in other securities to obtain exposure to the constituent securities of the applicable Index in a manner that is consistent with the investment objective and investment strategy of the First Trust ETF.

In this case, the First Trust ETF may also obtain exposure to the applicable Index by holding securities of a US-listed index ETF, First Trust Consumer Staples AlphaDEX® Fund (NYSE Arca ticker: FXG), of an affiliate of the Manager, which replicates or substantially replicates the applicable Index.

Risk

The risks associated with an investment in the First Trust ETF remain as discussed in the First Trust ETF's most recent prospectus. There have been no significant changes during the period that affected the overall level of risk associated with the First Trust ETF. The First Trust ETF provides exposure to the consumer staples sector of the U.S. equity market in either a non-U.S. currency hedged and U.S. currency hedged manner.

Results of Operations

General

The First Trust ETF's total net asset value as of December 31, 2019 was \$2,297,347 or \$25.71 per Unit ("FHC") and \$20.24 per Hedged Unit ("FHC.F"). The First Trust ETF's total net asset value as of December 31, 2018 was \$6,607,395 or \$22.80 per FHC and \$17.31 per FHC.F.

For the year ended December 31, 2019, the First Trust ETF paid total cash distributions per unit of \$0.4145 for FHC and \$0.2046 for FHC.F. In addition, the First Trust ETF declared cash distributions per unit of \$0.1900 for FHC and \$0.1500 for FHC.F for record date of December 31, 2019 with payment date of January 8, 2020.

Investment Performance

For the year ended December 31, 2019, FHC returned 14.49% compared to Russell 1000® Consumer Staples Index (CAD) (the "benchmark") total return of 17.82% while FHC.F returned 18.68% compared to Russell 1000® Consumer Staples Index (USD) (the "hedged benchmark") total return of 24.10%. Unlike the benchmark and the hedged benchmark, the First Trust ETF's returns are net of fees and expenses.

As of December 31, 2019, the consumer staples sector accounted for 5.93% of the weight of the Russell 1000® Index. The benchmark underperformed the Russell 1000® Index (CAD) which returned 24.78%. The hedged benchmark underperformed the Russell 1000® Index (USD) which returned 31.43%.

The portfolio held 36 equity securities as of December 31, 2019. The top ten equity holdings accounted for 44.44% of the portfolio. The AlphaDEX[™] stock selection process is a rules-based process and can result in industry weightings that differ from that of the benchmark and the hedged benchmark.

The First Trust ETF underperformed during the period due to stock selection, mostly within the Personal Care, Drug & Grocery Stores industry. Specifically, within the Personal Care sub-industry, a significant underweight position in

Procter & Gamble Company contributed to the underperformance as this stock performed well during the period. Strong industry allocation mitigated the underperformance, especially in the Agriculture Fishing & Ranching and Foods sub-industries.

FHC underperformed FHC.F during the period because of its exposure to the U.S. dollar, which depreciated 4.7% against the Canadian dollar from December 31, 2018 to December 31, 2019. FHC.F is not exposed to movements in the U.S. dollar.

The top five stocks by contribution to return were Pilgrim's Pride Corporation, Tyson Foods, Inc. Class A, Conagra Brands, Inc., Campbell Soup Company, and General Mills, Inc. The bottom five stocks by contribution to return were Kraft Heinz Company, Herbalife Nutrition Ltd., Nu Skin Enterprises, Inc. Class A, Monster Beverage Corporation, and Sprouts Farmers Markets, Inc.

Recent Developments

The Russell 1000® Index rebounded from steep losses in the fourth quarter of 2018 to post a 28.89% price return in 2019, its best year since 2013. The U.S dollar depreciated relative to the Canadian dollar in 2019, meaning the index gained 22.78% over the same period measured in Canadian dollars. 2019's gain capped a strong decade for U.S. stocks in which the Russell 1000® Index advanced 11.29% annualized before dividends, measured in U.S. dollars. This year's gains were propelled in part by three interest rate cuts by the U.S Federal Reserve in the second half of the year, a strong U.S. economy, and positive trade developments at the end of the year. The Fed cut rates to sustain the U.S. economic expansion and buffer it from a slowdown in global growth. Additionally, the Fed cited weak growth in certain areas of the U.S. economy, such as business investment, and low inflation for its accommodative moves. The U.S. economy remained strong during the period, despite weakness in manufacturing, with the unemployment rate reaching its lowest level since 1969 at 3.5%. Moreover, real GDP grew at least 2% annualized in each of the three quarters with data during the period. The year ended strong, with the Russell 1000® advancing in each of the final four months of the year. Positive trade developments contributed to the rally, as the U.S. and China agreed to a phase-one trade deal that is expected to be signed in 2020. The yield on the benchmark U.S. 10-year Treasury fell as low as 1.5% during the period but finished higher at 1.9%. After 2019's gains, the Russell 1000® Index finished the year trading at a P/E multiple of 22.3, compared to 16.9 at the end of 2018, with a dividend yield of 1.78%.

Related Party Transactions

FT Portfolios Canada Co. is the Manager of the First Trust ETF and is a Canadian affiliate of First Trust Advisors L.P., the investment advisor (the "Advisor") of the First Trust ETF.

Pursuant to terms of the declaration of trust of the First Trust ETF, the Manager provides or arranges for all management, administrative and other services required by the First Trust ETF. The Manager receives a management fee from the First Trust ETF. For further details, please see "Management Fees".

The Manager has retained the Advisor to provide certain services to the First Trust ETF pursuant to an investment advisory agreement. The Advisor receives advisory fees from the Manager out of the management fee.

⁽¹⁾ Management expense ratio is based on total expenses (excluding commissions and other portfolio transaction costs) for the stated period/year and is expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net asset value during the period/year.

Management Fees

The First Trust ETF will pay the Manager a management fee of 0.70% based on the average daily NAV of the First Trust ETF. The management fee, plus applicable taxes including HST, will be accrued daily and paid monthly in arrears. The Manager may, from time to time in its discretion, waive all or a portion of the management fee charged at any given time.

⁽²⁾ The trading expense ratio represents total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net asset value during the period/year.

⁽³⁾ The First Trust ETF's portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively the First Trust ETF's portfolio advisor manages its portfolio investments. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the First Trust ETF buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the period/year. The higher a First Trust ETF's portfolio turnover rate in a period/year, the greater the trading cost payable by the First Trust ETF in the period/year, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the period/year. There is not necessarily a relationship between high turnover rate and the performance of a First Trust ETF.


Past Performance

General

Year by Year Returns
